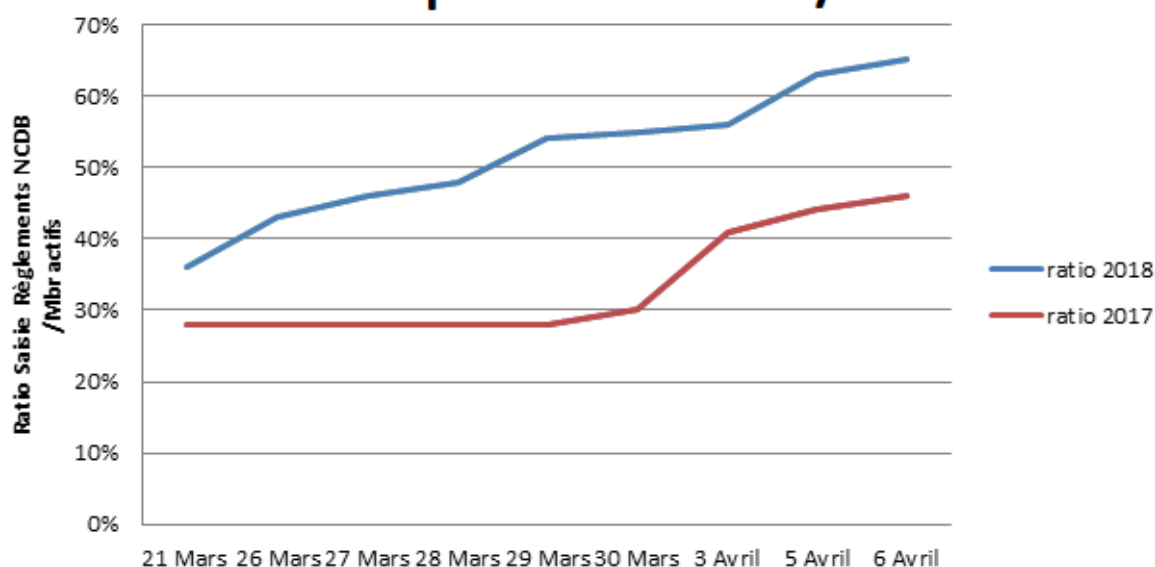

Dear Philippe

1) Proposal to Admin Council to be decided in August 2018:

Give to all CIGRE members access to Session papers via e-cigre 3 months after each session. Then the procedures would be coherent with the text in the attached pdf-file, which clearly states that members get session papers. The member benefit is advertised: " - Papers and Proceedings of Session and Symposia." From this text it is not possible to understand that a member does not get session papers until after the following session. The file has an exception for Green books but no exception on session papers.

If this proposal is not accepted in Admin Council, the text about publication in the member benefits should be changed so that it is clear for all members and those considering to become members that session papers come available only after 2 years also for members unless they have not been in the session. The text could be for example:

" Papers and Proceedings of Session and Symposia 2 years after the event"

In this case marketing the membership would probably become a bit more difficult.

2) Background:

We had today the meeting of the Nordic National Committees of CIGRE (NRCC) and discusses this issue of getting the session papers after a session only via a registration number and not via CIGRE-membership. I mean this text in the forwarded e-mail: " Session papers 2016 are available in e-cigre (see below), but for purchase.

Only the delegates of the 2016 Session can access and download the papers and proceedings of 2016 Session for free (it was included in their registration fee), from the delegates platform (they need to input their delegate number): http://sessiondocuments2016fordelegates.cigre.org/Site/documents/full_papers.asp "

This probably was decided somewhere (I do not remember such) but in our NRCC meeting thought this is not really a good issue.

Dear Liisa,

Thank you for your message.

The choice of selling (not providing for free) Session papers & proceedings (SP&P) to non-delegates, whether they are CIGRE members or not, is a very old decision. It has probably been like this since the early days of CIGRE.

The intention was to give priority to the delegates who pay their registration fees. The SP&P are an important part of their package.

The decision to give to possibility to download for free any paper after three years to anybody including non-members, is more recent (2015).

The intention was to show non-members the kind of documents they may get for free, as soon as they are published, if they become CIGRE members.

As a consequence, the SP&P, initially "free" for delegates (it is more correct to say included in their registration fees), are now available for free to anybody after three years.

Of course, these documents are available for a non-delegate at any time, but against a modest payment compared to registration fees (80 € for a non-member, with -50% for CIGRE members).

Your proposal aims at providing free access to CIGRE members to SP&P, is good for members. But you have to consider that it reduces the advantage of being a delegate.

Therefore, your proposal deserves to be discussed within a small Task Force that should consider all these aspects and come to the Steering Committee with a discussed proposal.

Lisa,

Thank you for your suggestion. I support the view of Philippe as we need to discuss the reasons for the ruling in the first instance. We could argue that the delegates receive the papers in advance

which they require for the Session. This is the benefit of being a delegate. For non-delegates (members only) it may be feasible to allow all papers from Symposia, conferences, colloquia and the Session to be made free of charge perhaps one month after the event (to allow uploading and access to the website). I feel that the decision made should be uniform for all events for members. Non members who are not delegates should pay for all papers less than three years old.

I will follow up with Philippe as to the formation of the task team in the Steering Committee and we can discuss this at the next Steerco meeting in May.
